

DESIGN FOR A SCARF.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,506, dated March 5, 1878; application filed January 19, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY G. FISK, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed an ornamental pattern for the reverse or under side of gentle-men's made-up scarfs or ties, of which the following is an exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The drawing represents the reverse or un-

der side of a combined scarf and tie.

A is the tie proper to pass around the neck; B, the shield or stiff pad secured centrally under the upper end of the scarf, and under which the free end of the tie is passed and secured; C C, linings covering the under side of the crossed ends of the scarf, and D a transverse lining-piece covering and neatly concealing the under side and end of the central piece of the scarf. The lower unconfined edge of this transverse covering or lining piece D, and of each of the linings C C, is ornamented

and prettily finished with round or pointed notches to form a scalloped or serrated border, substantially as illustrated at w w and w' in the drawing.

Suitable colors should be selected for the linings to produce, by contrast with the body of the tie, a harmonious effect, and the ornamented edges of the linings C C of the ends of the scarf may be made to project slightly, so as to appear in front.

The angles and depth of the notches in the serrated border w may be varied without departing from my design.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for the reverse or lined side of a scarf, consisting of the serrated or scalloped edges w w', substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
