

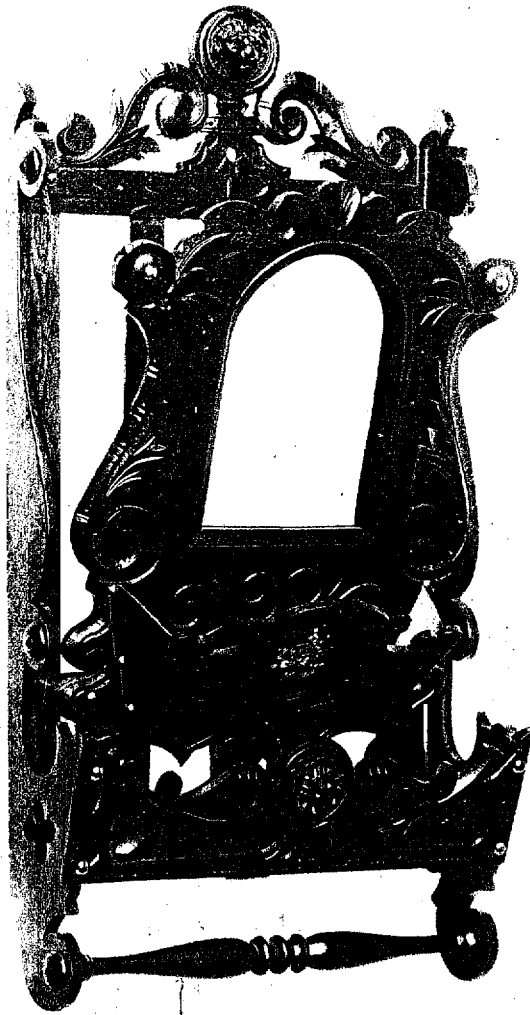

DESIGN FOR WALL-POCKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,507**, dated March 5, 1878; application filed February 23, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LAWRENCE N. B. GRAY, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a new and useful shape or configuration for a Combined Wall-Pocket, Mirror, Mirror-Frame, Comb-Case, and Towel-Rack, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my design, showing the paper-rack behind the mirror and mirror-frame, having the comb-case near its bottom, beneath which is the hair-brush receptacle, and below the bottom of this is the towel rod or rack.

A represents the back of the wall-pocket, formed of a series of vertical strips of wood, B, leaving open spaces C between them, with scroll-work at the top. D represents a paper-rack, attached to the back of the wall-pocket

by chains E at its top, and by a pivoted cross-piece between the end pieces F, at its bottom. The front of the paper-rack D has an opening with an oval or semicircular top, forming a mirror-frame, H, containing a mirror, J, beneath which is a folding comb-case, K, and below this a hair-brush receptacle, L, and below the bottom of this is the towel rod or rack P, suspended between the downward-projecting end pieces F F.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a combined wall-pocket, mirror, mirror-frame, comb-case, and towel-rack, consisting of the back A, formed of a series of vertical strips, B, leaving open spaces C, paper-rack D, mirror-frame H, mirror J, comb-case K, hair-brush receptacle L, and towel-rod P, all substantially as described and shown.
