DESIGN FOR A STATUETTE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,513, dated March 12, 1878; application filed February 18, 1878. [Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE S. BARKEN-TIN, of Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Statuary, of which the follow-

ing is a specification:
This invention relates to a design for a statuette representing "Minnehaha;" and consists in the figure as shown in the accompanying

illustration.

An Indian girl is represented seated on a rock, her blanket draping from her back, hair falling over her shoulders, her right hand

resting on one knee, the other holding a scart which lies across her lap, the left foot extended, exposing the moccasin, and all as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim-

The herein-described design for a statuette, consisting of the figure of an Indian girl seated on a rock, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
