## DESIGN FOR A STATUETTE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,513**, dated March 12, 1878; application filed February 18, 1878.  
[Term of patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, GEORGE S. BARKENTIN, of Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Statuary, of which the following is a specification:

This invention relates to a design for a statuette representing "Minnehaha;" and consists in the figure as shown in the accompanying illustration.

An Indian girl is represented seated on a rock, her blanket draping from her back, hair falling over her shoulders, her right hand

resting on one knee, the other holding a scarf which lies across her lap, the left foot extended, exposing the moccasin, and all as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The herein-described design for a statuette, consisting of the figure of an Indian girl seated on a rock, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
