

DESIGN FOR OIL-CLOTHS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,515, dated March 12, 1878; application filed February 25, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES HUTCHISON, of Newark, New Jersey, have originated and designed a Pattern for Oil-Cloths, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification. The nature of my design is fully shown in

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists, substantially, of a series of elongated hexagonal figures, A, arranged, as shown, so as to surround and inclose squares B. The hexagons A contain smaller hexagons C, concentric with them. The smaller hexagons are surrounded by ornamental borderings D, and contain central rosettes E. The squares B are composed of bars F G, crossing each other, of corner squares H, and of a central leaf-spray, I.

I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States—

The design for oil-cloths, consisting, substantially, of a series of elongated hexagonal figures, A, ornamented as described, and arranged to surround and inclose squares B, also ornamented as described, the whole substantially as shown.
