

DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,519, dated March 12, 1878; application filed March 1, 1878.

[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM B. KENDALL, of Brooklyn, Kings county, New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet, of which the following is a specification.

The accompanying photograph illustrates my new design.

This invention relates to a new design for a carpet, oil-cloth, or similar fabric; and consists in the new arrangement and ornamentation of

figures hereinafter described.

The letter A represents my newly-designed carpet, having a border, B, at one side. The carpet A is ornamented by a series of vase-shaped ornaments, a a, which extend, with their upper portions, into the border B, and there terminate in rosettes b b, as shown. The carpet is divided by transverse lines c c into a series of rectangular sections, d d, each alternate section containing one of the above-described ornaments a. Across the stem of each vase-like ornament a is placed a fern-leaf, e, producing a peculiar effect, as shown, while the alternate sections d d, which do not contain the vase-shaped ornaments a, are embellished by suitable floral decorations, f. The

border B is, between the rosettes b, divided into a series of rectangular panels, g, which are embellished by ornamental scrolls.

I claim as my invention-

1. The design for a carpet having a series of vase-shaped ornaments, a, that terminate in rosettes b, substantially as shown.

2. The design for a carpet, A, having border B of the vase-shaped ornaments a, that extend with their upper ends into the border B, substantially as shown.

3. The design for the border B, having rosettes b and rectangular panels g, substantially

as shown.

- 4. The design for a carpet having rectangular sections dd, each alternate section containing a vase-shaped ornament, a, substantially as shown.
- 5. The design for a carpet having the vaseshaped ornament a and the fern-leaf e, placed over the stem of the vase, substantially as shown.
