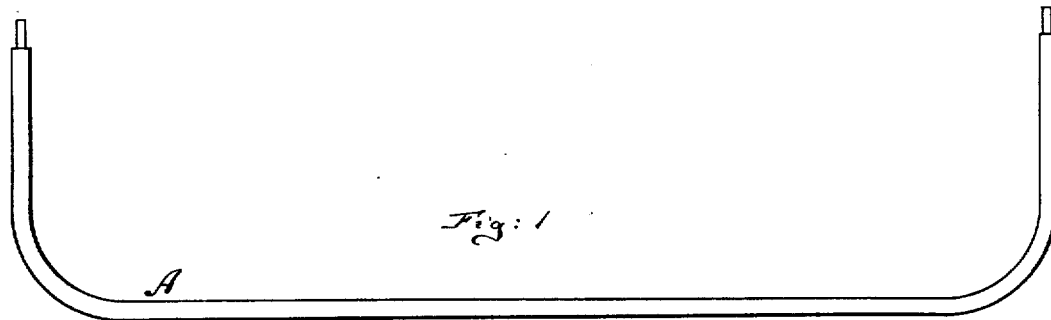

DESIGN FOR BROW-BANDS FOR BRIDLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,523**, dated March 12, 1878; application filed February 6, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANZ MEINBERG, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Brow-Band for Harness, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a top view of the brow-band; Fig. 2, a front view of the same, showing my new design.

This invention relates to a new ornamentation for brow-bands for harness; and consists in ornamenting the brow-band with the representation of a chain and center piece, which is painted or stamped upon the face thereof.

In the drawings, the letter A represents

the brow-band. The front or face thereof is ornamented by the representation of a straight chain, B, placed lengthwise thereon, as shown in Fig. 2. C is an ornamental center piece placed within the chain in the center of the band.

I claim—

The design for a brow-band having the representation of a chain, B, and center piece C, substantially as shown.
