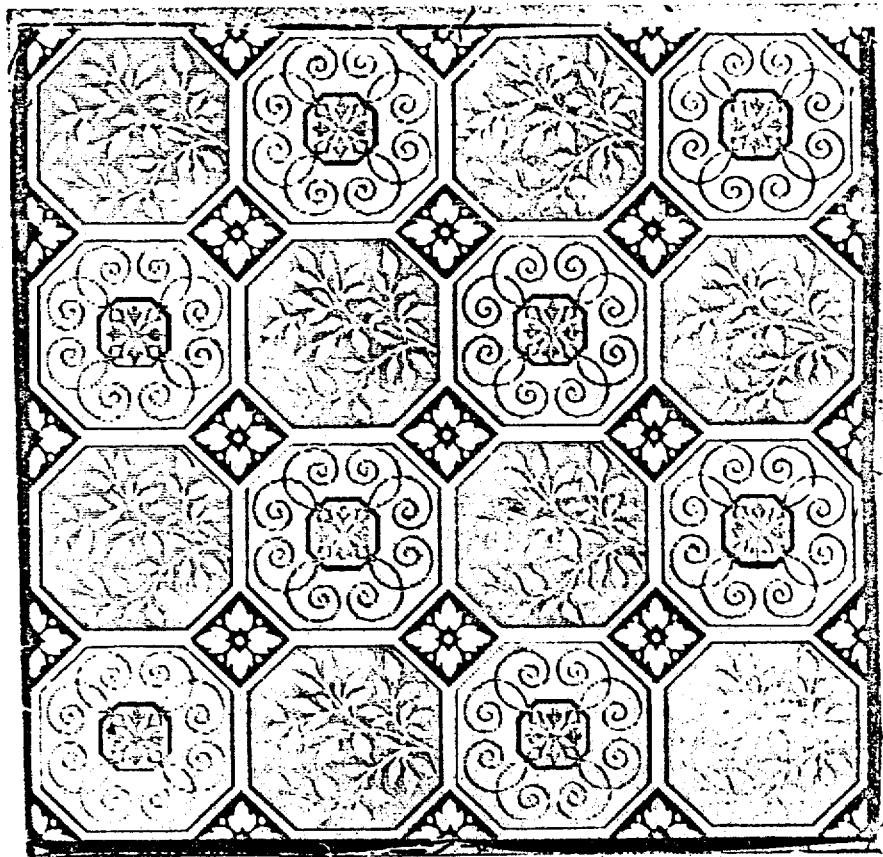

DESIGN FOR OIL-CLOTHS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,525**, dated March 12, 1878; application filed February 25, 1878.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CORNELIA M. POST, of Plainfield, New Jersey, have originated and designed a Pattern for Oil-Cloths, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification.

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists, substantially, of a succession of octagonal figures, A B, arranged in checker-board plan, and divided off by bands C, at the intersection of which are small squares D. The octagonal figures A B occur alternately in either direction.

The octagonal figures A contain sprays of leaves E, and the figures B contain a central octagonal figure, F, ornamented with inverted leaves, and surrounded by an ornamentation

of scroll-work, G. The squares D inclose inverted leaves.

I claim as my invention and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States—

The design for oil-cloths, consisting, substantially, of a series of alternate octagonal figures, A and B, respectively containing leaf-sprays E, and octagons F, and scroll-work G, and the leaf-ornamented squares D, the whole arranged as shown and described.
