

DESIGN FOR OIL-CLOTHS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,526**, dated March 12, 1878; application filed February 25, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS E. PENNELL, of Brooklyn, New York, have originated and designed a Pattern for Oil-Cloths, of which I hereby declare the following to be a specification.

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design consists, substantially, of a succession of squares, A B, arranged in checkerboard plan, and divided off by bands C, at the intersections of which are smaller squares D. The squares A and B occur alternately in either direction.

The squares A contain central circles E, ornamented with inverted leaves F, and the corner portions of octagonal figures G, represented as placed beneath the intersections of the bands C, in such manner as to appear only in the corners of the large squares.

The squares B contain a spray of leaves, H, and the corner portions of the octagonal figures G, as before set forth.

I claim as my invention and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States—

The design for oil-cloths, consisting substantially of a series of alternate squares A and B, respectively containing circles E and leaf-sprays H, and divided off by bands C, with squares D and octagonal figures G, the whole arranged as shown and described.
