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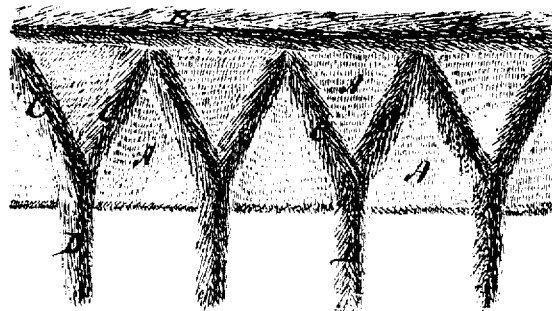

DESIGN FOR A FUR TRIMMING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,531**, dated March 12, 1878; application filed February 19, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GOTTHILF F. WILHELM, of New York, in the State of New York, have originated a new Design for Fur Trimming for Ladies' Dresses and other Purposes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

A represents a band of fur of any desired width and quality. On the upper end or edge a stripe or band of fur, B, usually made of the tail parts of the animal, is arranged and attached. From this band B corresponding tail-pieces C C are laid and attached diagonally downward, so as to form triangles upon the

main band A, each two pieces C meeting at the lower edge of the band A, and finishing in a single tail-piece, D.

Suitable varieties of furs, in regard to quality and color, should be employed to produce a harmonious effect.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a fur trimming composed of the base-band A, heading-band B, and Y-shaped strips C D, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
