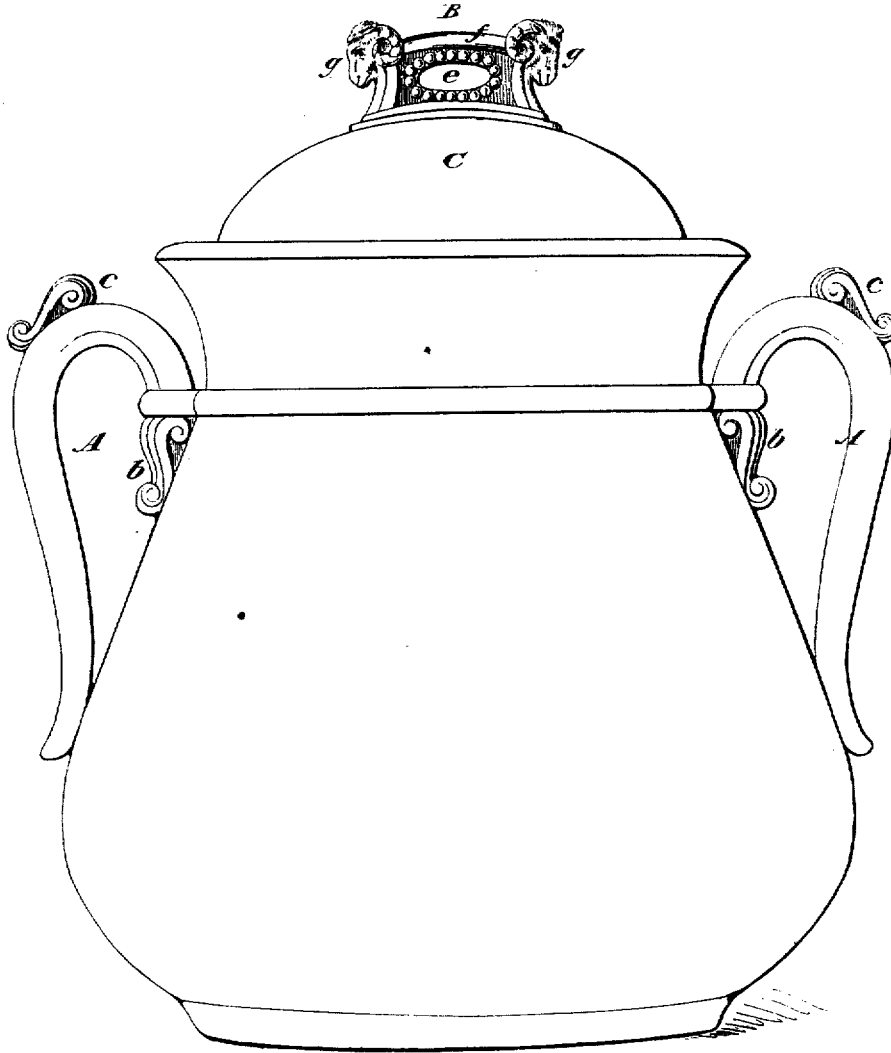

## DESIGN FOR HANDLES FOR COVERED DISHES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,538**, dated March 19, 1878; application filed March 1, 1878.

[Term of patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, JAMES BARLOW and JAMES MOSES, of Trenton, in the county of Mercer and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Handles for Covered Dishes, of which the following is a specification:

A represents the side handles, and B the cover-handle. The side handles are round in section, and are formed upon a reversed curve, the upper portion of the curve being nearly a half-circle, ending squarely on a horizontal line at its juncture with the body of the dish. A bead is formed around this end of the handle, and below the handle a scroll-bracket, *b*, is placed against the side of the dish.

A knob, C, similar in form to the bracket *b*, is placed in the upper convex portion of the handle.

Upon the cover C there is a flat oblong handle, B, having a central elliptical opening, *e*,

surrounded with beads. The upper edge of the handle is rounded, and at each side there is a bead-molding, *f*. At opposite ends of the handle there are rams' heads *g*, looking outward, one head at each end of the handle, with horns overlapping the middle portion of the handle.

We claim as our invention—

1. A design for a dish-handle, in which the upper portion of the handle is supported upon a scroll-bracket, and has upon its upper convex portion a scroll-shaped knob, substantially as above described.

2. A cover-handle having an elliptical aperture surrounded by beads, and having at each end a ram's head, substantially as described.
