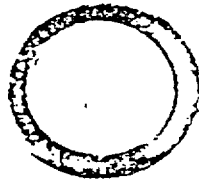

DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,540**, dated March 19, 1878; application filed February 8, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES FALLOWS, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Mourning-Badge, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

My design consists of a front in ring form and a back in the form of a cross. The design is essentially emblematic in its character, the

cross being the symbol of faith, and the circle of everlasting glory.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a mourning or memorial badge, consisting of the ring front and the cross, as described, and illustrated in the accompanying photograph.
