

DESIGN FOR CHAIRS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,594, dated March 26, 1878; application filed February 4, 1878. [Term of patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES PENCHARD, of New York city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a Chair, of which the following is a full and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The chair is more particularly designed for dining. I propose to distinguish this design by the mark "223C."

A is the seat, which is flat or plain on top, and beaded around the edge. Bare the back rails, beaded with vertical beads above the seat and plain top, and C is a cross-rail with a plain top and scalloped and notched bottom. It is beaded across the front. D are crossrails, and E are spindles, which appear continuous beyond the cross-rails D from the low points in the top rail C. Each presents a dec-

orated enlargement, as indicated by E'. G are turned legs, swelled and beaded, as shown. There are two stretchers, H, turned with beads across the front, and two of lighter hue are placed each side.

I claim as my invention-

The design for a chair herein described, consisting of the beaded seat A, provided with legs, beaded back posts B connected by scalloped cross-rail C, and rails D, and the vertical bars E provided with decorative enlargements E', as herein specified.
