

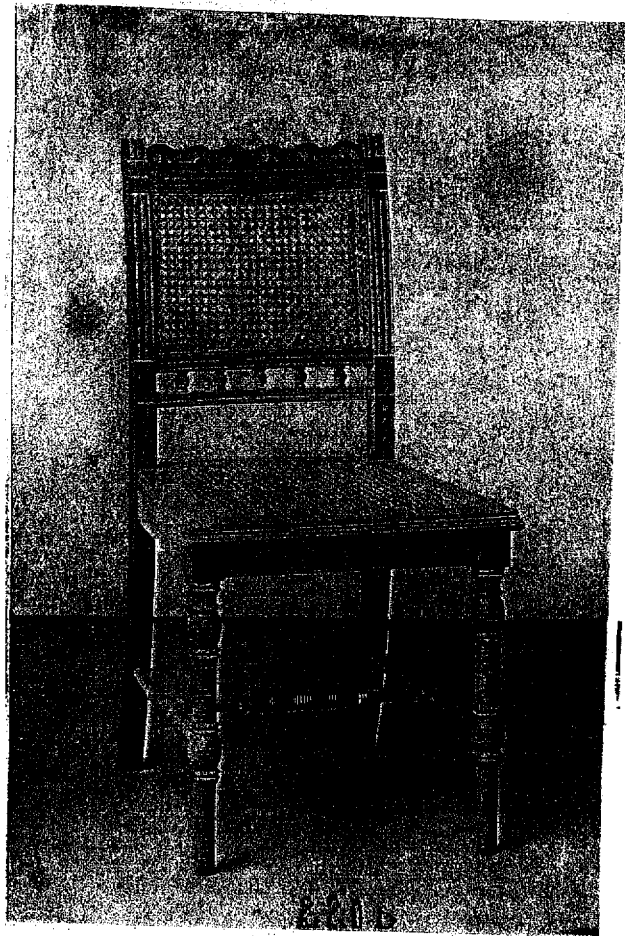

# UNITED STATES PATENT OFFICE.

## DESIGN FOR CHAIRS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,595**, dated March 26, 1878; application filed February 25, 1878.  
[Term of patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHARLES PENCHARD, of New York city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a Chair, of which the following is a full and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The chair is more particularly designed for dining. I propose to distinguish this design by the mark "220D."

A is the seat, which is flat or plane on top, and beaded around the edge. A' is a deep straight-edged molding below. B are the back posts, beaded transversely and vertically; C, the top rail, carved with cross-lines and scallops; D, the shield or main back surface; and E F are cross-rails, having a small opening between, with short vertical bars. The legs G and stretchers H are turned with swells and beads.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for a chair-seat herein described, consisting of the flat or plane top A, beaded around the edge, and provided with the straight-edged molding A', as herein specified.

2. The design for a chair-back herein de-

scribed, consisting of the transversely and vertically beaded back posts, B, top rail C, carved with longitudinal lines and scallops, shield D, and cross-rails E F, carved with longitudinal lines, and having short vertical bars connecting them, as herein specified.

3. The design for chair-legs herein described, consisting of the hind legs G, rectangular in cross-section, front legs, provided with swells and beads, and stretchers H, having swells and beads, as herein specified.

4. The design for a chair as herein described, consisting of the transversely and vertically beaded back posts B, top rail C, carved with longitudinal lines and scallops, shield D, cross-rails E F, carved with longitudinal lines, and having vertical bars connecting them, beaded seat A, rectangular hind legs, front legs, provided with swells, and stretchers H, turned with swells and beads, as herein specified.
