DESIGN FOR CHAIRS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,596**, dated March 26, 1878; application filed February 4, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES PENCHARD, of New York city, in the county and State of New York, have originated and designed a Chair, of which the following is a full and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The chair is more particularly designed for dining. I propose to distinguish this design by the mark "221D."

A is a seat, beaded around the edge and slightly enlarged at the bottom. A' is a scalloped molding depending from the seat. B are the back posts, turned at intervals with beads and swells. The top of each has an acorn molding, and the faces of the squared part below are decorated with arabesques.

C are strong and curved braces or arms, beaded on the curved upper surface, with a button or arabesque on the front end. The top rail of the back is deep, and is carved with crown-like points. It is beaded across the front. A deep cross-rail, D, below is beaded near the top and bottom, and is decorated between with oblique lines.

E is the shield or main surface of the back. There is a space between its beaded upright edges and the posts.

F are the front legs, and G the stretchers, both richly swelled and beaded.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for a chair-seat herein described, consisting of the seat A, beaded in its front edge, and provided with the dependent scalloped molding A', as herein specified.

2. The design for a chair-back herein described, consisting of the back posts B, (turned at intervals with beads and swells, and provided at their upper ends with acorns,) connected by cross-rails decorated with arabesques, curved decorated braces C, and shield E, as herein specified.

3. The design for a chair herein described, consisting of the posts B, decorated as described, and connected by cross-rails ornamented with arabesques, curved braces C, shield E, beaded seat A, legs F, and round G with swells, as herein specified.
