

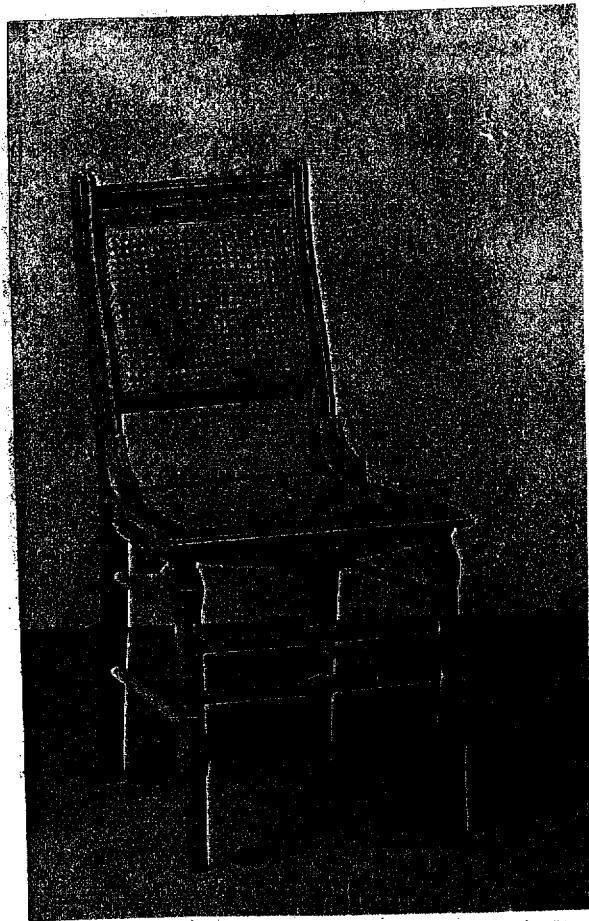

DESIGN FOR CHAIRS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,597**, dated March 26, 1878; application filed February 4, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES PENCHARD, of New York city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a Chair, of which the following is a full and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The chair is more particularly designed for dining. I propose to distinguish this design by the mark "224D."

A is the seat, beveled and beaded around the edge. A' are pointed ornaments hanging from the seat. B are posts, gracefully curved, beaded up and down the front and across the top. C are small braces or arms, curved and similarly beaded. The top rail D is deep, and beaded horizontally. The bot-

tom rail E of the back is less deep. G is the shield or body of the back. The front legs H and stretchers I are turned with swells.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a chair herein described, consisting of the seat A, beveled and beaded around its edge, and provided with the pointed ornaments A', and front legs H having stretchers I, provided with swells, curved beaded posts B, curved beaded braces C, beaded cross-rails D E, and shield G, as herein specified.
