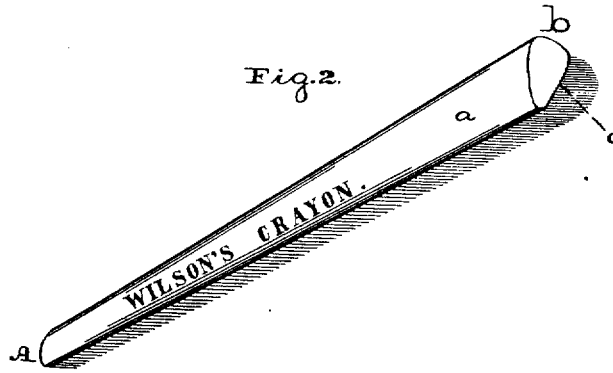

## DESIGN FOR CRAYONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,608**, dated March 26, 1878; application filed February 14, 1878.  
[Term of patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, J. WILSON SWARTS, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Crayon, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making part of this specification.

Figure 1 is a side elevation. Fig. 2 is a perspective view. Figs. 3 and 4 are views of opposite ends.

A represents a piece of crayon, having three sides, *a b c*, the sides *a b* being curved or convex, and the side *c* being flat, thus presenting

in cross-section a somewhat triangular figure. The piece is tapering from end to end.

It will be seen that I produce a neat and attractive shape.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for crayon, the same consisting of the tapering piece A, having two curved sides, *a b*, and a flat side, *c*, all as above described, and illustrated in the accompanying drawings.
