DESIGN FOR CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,613**, dated April 2, 1878; application filed March 21, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANCIS CARPENTER, of Burrillville, in the county of Providence and State of Rhode Island, have originated and designed a Pattern in Cassimeres; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, which form a part of this specification.

The design is shown by the accompanying photographs, of which the following is a description.

A represents a narrow stripe running warpwise, which is composed of a series of thick cords running weftwise. B represents a wide stripe formed of a series of small bars, running warpwise and weftwise, and crossing at

right angles, thus forming small squares. C is a stripe similar in construction to stripe A, and differs only in its being wider than stripe A, and, like A and B, it stripes the pattern lengthwise.

I claim as my invention—

The design as above described, and shown by the accompanying photographic illustrations.
