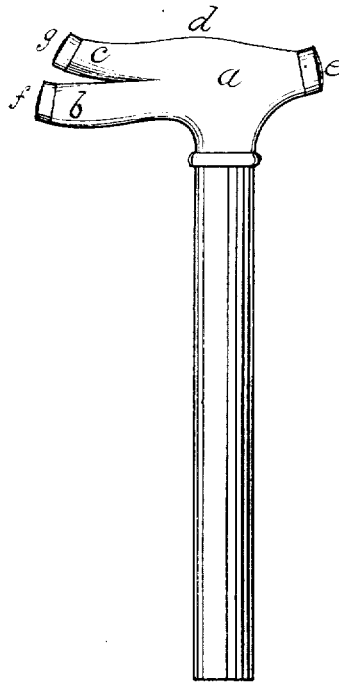

DESIGN FOR UMBRELLA-HANDLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,616**, dated April 2, 1878; application filed March 6, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, F. JULIUS KALDENBERG, of New York, in the county and State of New York, have originated and designed a Handle for Parasols and Umbrellas, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The design consists of a new and improved form for parasol and umbrella handles. This form or configuration resembles a branch with two offshoots from such branch.

In the drawing accompanying this specification, *a* is the branch, and *b c* are the two offshoots, which, taken together, compose the handle, that is attached to the stick of the par-

asol in any well-known way so as to be at right angles to such stick. This handle may have a waved outline on its upper portion, as seen at *d*, and the offshoot *c* has a little more curvature, and is shorter than the offshoot *b*.

Gold or other metal tips may be attached to the ends of the branch *a* and offshoots *b c*, as seen at *e f g*.

I claim—

The design of parasol-handle, consisting of the branch *a* and offshoots *b c* from such branch, substantially as described and shown.
