

DESIGN FOR UMBRELLA-HANDLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,616, dated April 2,1878; application filed March 6, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, F. Julius Kalden-BERG, of New York, in the county and State of New York, have originated and designed a Handle for Parasols and Umbrellas, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact de-scription, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The design consists of a new and improved form for parasol and umbrella handles. This form or configuration resembles a branch with two offshoots from such branch.

In the drawing accompanying this specification, a is the branch, and b c are the two offshoots, which, taken together, compose the handle, that is attached to the stick of the par-

asol in any well-known way so as to be at right angles to such stick. This handle may have a waved outline on its upper portion, as seen at d, and the offshoot c has a little more curvature, and is shorter than the offshoot b.

Gold or other metal tips may be attached to the ends of the branch a and offshoots b c, as seen at efg.

I claim-

The design of parasol-handle, consisting of the branch a and offshoots b c from such branch, substantially as described and shown.
