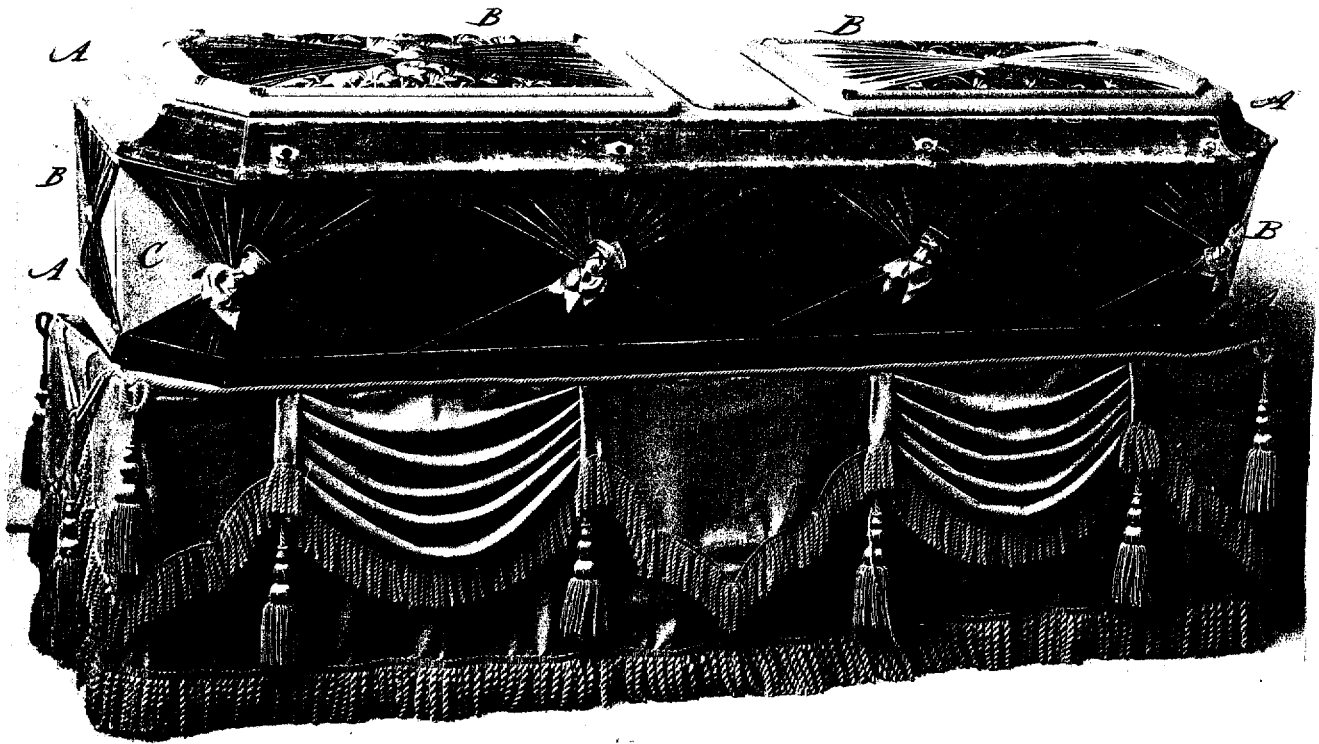

DESIGN FOR BURIAL-CASKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,630**, dated April 16, 1878; application filed April 3, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM JAMES NOBLE, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Burial-Casket, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the body of the casket, which may be made with square, octagonal, or rounded ends, as may be desired, and of any required form or style. The top, sides, ends, and corners of the casket A are ornamented by a raying, B, called by me the "hour-glass ornamentation." The raying B may be made of velvet, cloth, silk, or other suitable fabric.

The narrow middle part or neck of the ornamentation B has a button, rosette, bow, or other ornament attached to it.

The diamond-shaped spaces C, formed between the rayings B, form a part of my design, and also form suitable places for the attachment of the handles.

I claim as my invention—

A design for a burial-casket, in which the top, sides, ends, and corners of the casket are ornamented with an hour-glass-shaped raying, B, substantially in the manner herein shown and described.
