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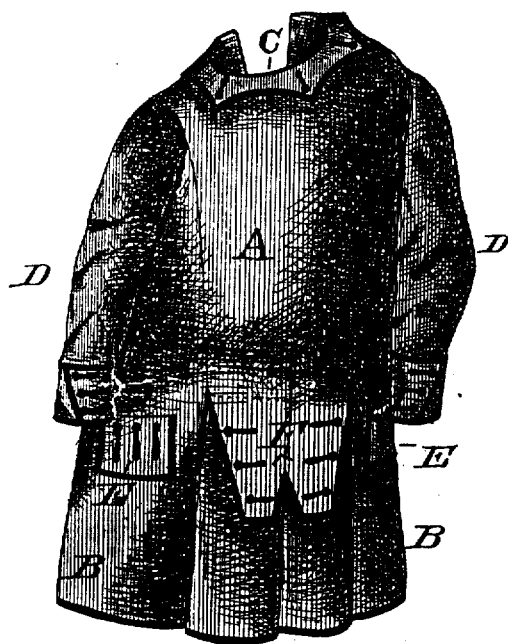

DESIGN FOR A CHILD'S DRESS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,634**, dated April 16, 1878; application filed February 27, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN McNEVEN, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Design for Children's Clothing; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms a part of this specification.

This design relates to clothing for children, such as an outer or over dress, being ornamented so as to represent what is termed a "swallow-tailed" coat upon the back part thereof.

The drawing represents a perspective view of a child's overdress. The upper portion, A, represents the body, the lower part, B, the

skirts, C the collar, and D the sleeves, the body being provided with pockets E; all of which may be trimmed as desired.

The ornamental swallow-tail F is upon the back part of the garment, as shown in the drawing, giving the garment, in this respect, the appearance of a swallow-tail coat.

What I claim as my invention, is—

The design for a child's dress consisting of back A, terminating in swallow-tails F, sides B, and sleeves D, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
