DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,636**, dated April 16, 1878; application filed February 18, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Rosto O. Wood, of Buffalo, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have invented a certain new and useful Design for a Badge, &c.; and I do hereby declare that the following description of my said invention, taken in connection with the accompanying sheet of drawings, forms a full, clear, and exact specification, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

This design refers to a badge, pin, officer's jewel, &c., adapted to be used by the members of the Ancient Order of United Workmen and others; and it consists of a shield whose chief points are covered by a ribbon, within which are inscribed the initial letters of the order, A. O. U. W. The honor-point, or center of the shield, is occupied by a heart, within which are placed the initial letters C. H. P. and the representation of an anchor. The lower half of the shield is striped, in representation of the national colors of the Union. This design, which is a symbolic representation of the device "Charity, Hope, and Protection," "Charity" being illustrated by the

heart, "Hope" by the anchor, and "Protection" by the shield, may be used as a badge, a pin, &c., and it can be carried out in any of the precious or inferior metals, printed or woven into or attached to ribbons, and in any and all the various manners in which such emblems are worn and used.

Having thus fully described my design, I desire to secure to me by Letters Patent of the

United States for seven years—

The design for a badge consisting essentially of a shield having the representation of a heart and anchor inscribed thereon, the anchor being entirely inclosed within the bordering lines of the heart, substantially as described and shown in the accompanying illustration.
