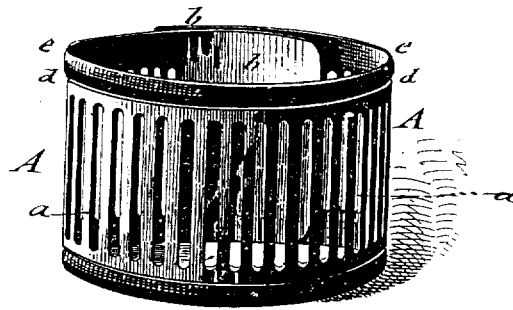
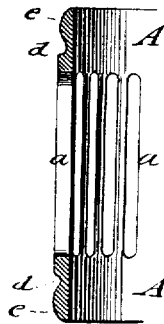

DESIGN FOR A BRACELET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,642**, dated April 16, 1878; application filed March 25, 1878.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN A. HEDSTROM, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Design for Bracelet, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 represents a perspective view of my improved bracelet, and Fig. 2 a detail vertical transverse section of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

The object of this invention is to furnish for bracelets, cuffs, and similar articles that are made of hard rubber, bone, metal, or other suitable material, an improved design of ornamental and neat appearance; and it consists of a bracelet, cuff, or other article made of a spring-band, with narrow parallel slots running transversely to the longitudinal axis of the band, between the solid ends, and having a depression and raised ornamental rim or bead at both sides of the slotted middle portion.

Referring to the drawing, A represents a

bracelet or other article made of a spring-band of suitable material. The band is provided with a number of parallel slots, *a*, that are cut out transversely to the longitudinal axis in the middle portion of the band between the solid ends.

The narrow slots are arranged at right angles to the edges of the spring-band, and are confined between ornamental depressions *d* and raised rims or beads *e*, that run along the edges of the band.

For bracelets or cuffs of greater width, the slots and ornamental beads may be duplicated, and thereby the ornamental effect increased.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The design for a bracelet consisting of the band A, having solid ends, intermediate transverse and parallel slots, ornamental depressions *d*, and beaded rim *e*, as shown and described.
