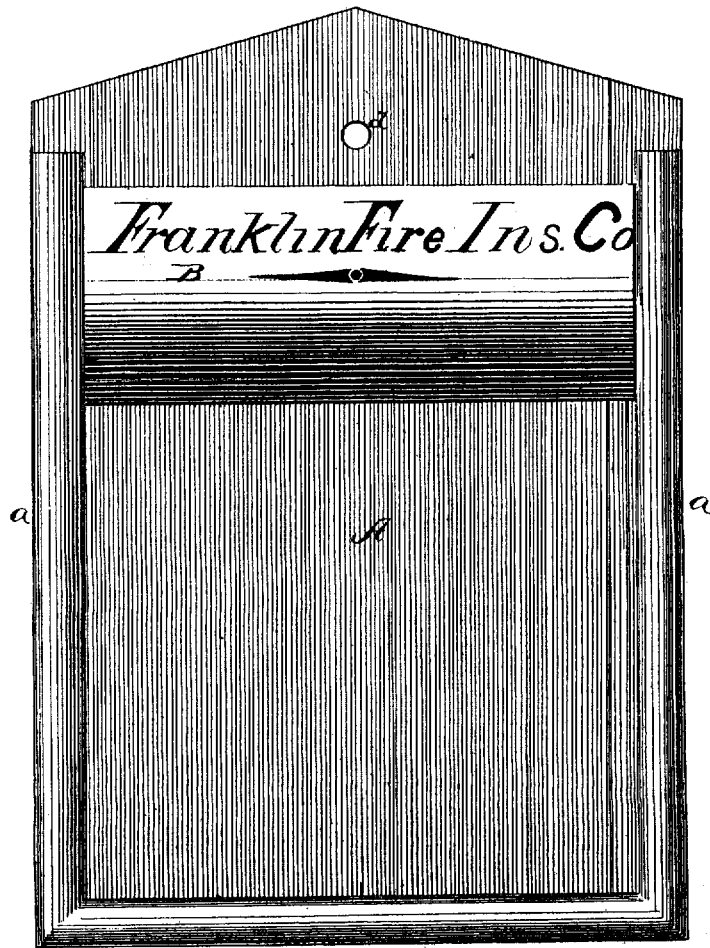
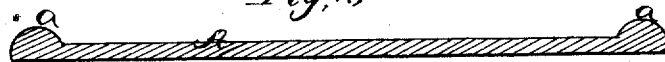

DESIGN FOR MATCH-SAFES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,644**, dated April 23, 1878; application filed April 3, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES H. DAVIS, of Ypsilanti, in the county of Washtenaw and State of Michigan, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Match-Safes; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully illustrated by the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is a front view, and Fig. 2 a cross-section, of my design for match-safe.

A represents the base, formed with a round raised bead, *a*, at each side and bottom. This base may be made of wood, paper, or any suitable material, and sanded. The top has

two inclined sides, meeting in the center, as shown, and below said center point is a hole, at *d*, for hanging up the match-safe. B is the safe, made in the form of a quarter-cylinder, with closed ends, and fastened to the base A in any suitable manner. The front of the safe may be used for advertising purposes.

What I claim is—

The design for a match-safe consisting of the base A, having raised beads *a a* at each side and bottom, inclined top, and the quarter-cylindrical safe B, as shown and described.
