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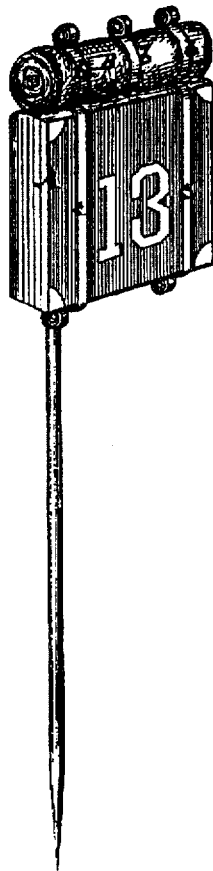

## DESIGN FOR A SCARF-PIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,645**, dated April 23, 1878; application filed April 5, 1878.  
[Term of patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY GRIFFITH, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented an Improved Design for the Heads of Scarf and Dress Pins, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, and which represents a view, in perspective, upon an enlarged scale, of a scarf-pin made in accordance with my improved design.

The head of the pin is composed of a quadrangular figure or body, A, representing a soldier's knapsack mounted by a roll, B, which represents an overcoat and blanket, or either.

Said roll is ornamented by bands *b b*, having eyes or loops at their upper ends, and arranged to encircle said roll in representation of straps for binding the roll together; and the knapsack A is furthermore ornamented by parallel raised bands *c c*, in representation of straps for binding and carrying the knapsack.

I claim—

The design for the head of a scarf or dress pin, consisting of a quadrangular figure, A, ornamented by parallel raised bands *c c*, and mounted by a roll, B, ornamented by bands *b b*, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
