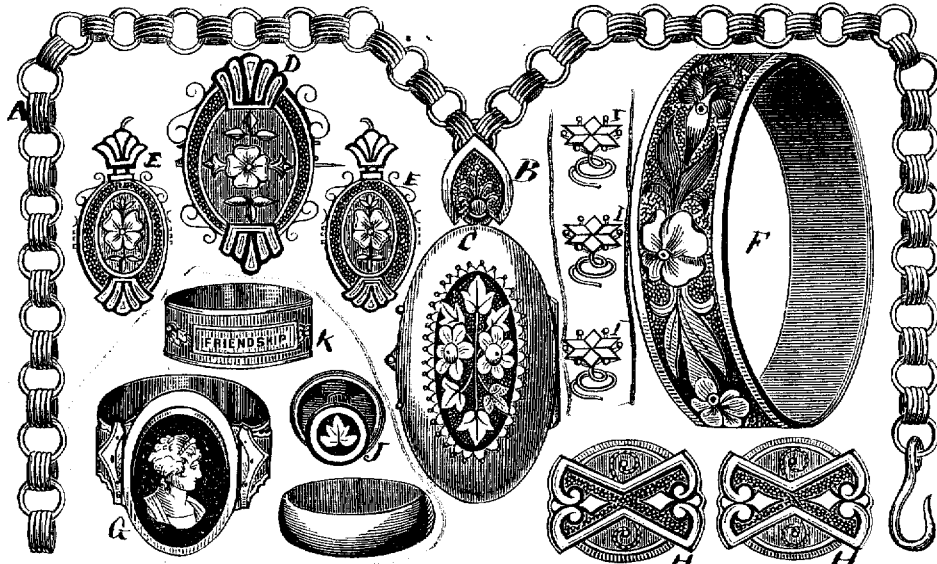

DESIGN FOR A SET OF JEWELRY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,648**, dated April 23, 1878; application filed March 27, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ABRAHAM STEINAN, Jr., of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, Ohio, have originated and designed a Set of Jewelry, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying engraving, making a part of this specification.

A represents the chain, B the pendant, and C the charm, of a necklace. The said chain A consists of alternate single and multiple links, as represented. The pendant B is of lotus-leaf form, and engraved with the representation of a flowering plant. The charm is convex and elliptical, and has an elliptical panel, C, with flower and leaf ornament, as shown.

D represents a brooch or pin, and E E represent ear-rings, all of elliptical form, and having elliptical panels ornamented by flowers and leaves, as shown.

F represents one of a pair of bracelets, each of which is encircled by the flower and leaf relief represented.

H H are cuff-buttons having the scroll ornamentation shown.

K is a ring having an ornamented panel inscribed with the word "Friendship."

What I claim as my invention is—

1. The design for a set of jewelry composed of the pendant B, locket C, brooch or pin D, ear-rings E, bracelet F, and cuff-buttons H, having the ornamental frosted ground, substantially as described and shown.

2. The design for a locket, C, having the sprig of flowers in relief upon a frosted panel, substantially as represented.

3. In combination with the locket C, ornamented as described, the design for a frosted pendant, B, with sprig of flowers in relief.

4. The design for a bracelet, F, having the wreath or garland of flowers in relief upon a frosted ground, substantially as shown.

5. The design for a lady's set, D E, having the frosted border encircling an oval panel, with sprig of flowers in relief, as represented.

6. The design for a cuff-button, H, with frosted panel, as shown.
