

DESIGN FOR ADVERTISING-MONUMENTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10.649, dated April 23, 1878; application filed March 23, 1878.

[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, James B. Turner, of the city of Rochester, in the county of Monroe and State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for Advertising-Monuments; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which represents an elevation of the device.

This design relates to monuments or slabs which are set in the ground at regular distances apart—say one mile—and have on their face the name of an individual, a firm, or a place, and the distance to such place. The object is to render the monument more ornamental than a plain board or slab.

To this end I cut or form the edges of the monument, from the surface of the ground upward, with a series of convex swells or scallops, a a, which meet at their angles at a sharp

line, and at the top I form two half-circles, b b, the convex sides standing outward, and uniting at an angle in the center of the top of the monument, as shown.

This monument or slab presents an ornamental and pleasing appearance, especially when painted, and is much more attractive than a straight-sided slab.

What I claim as new is-

The design for an advertising monument or slab, consisting of the convex scallops or swells a a at the sides and the two half-circles b b at the top of the monument or slab, as herein shown and described.
