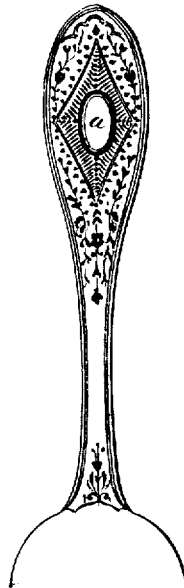

## DESIGN FOR SPOONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,654**, dated April 30, 1878; application filed April 19, 1878.  
[Term of patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JACOB HAMMARTH, of Wallingford, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Improvement in Design for Spoon; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents, in—

Figure 1, a front view.

This invention relates to a design for the handles of spoons, forks, and like articles of table-service; and consists in the configuration and ornamentation as shown in the accompanying illustration, and hereinafter described.

The outline of the handle is of substantially

what is known as the "Gothic shape," with a bead around the edge, dying out at the bowl. On the face of the handle is a figure of diamond shape, having a central plain surface, *a*, and with rays extending outward to form the body of the diamond figure. Around this diamond figure, and between it and the beaded edge, the surface is ornamented by a foliated tracery. The diamond-shaped ornament on the handle constitutes the chief characteristic of this design.

I claim—

The design for handle, consisting of the diamond-shaped figure on the face of the handle, and as herein described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
