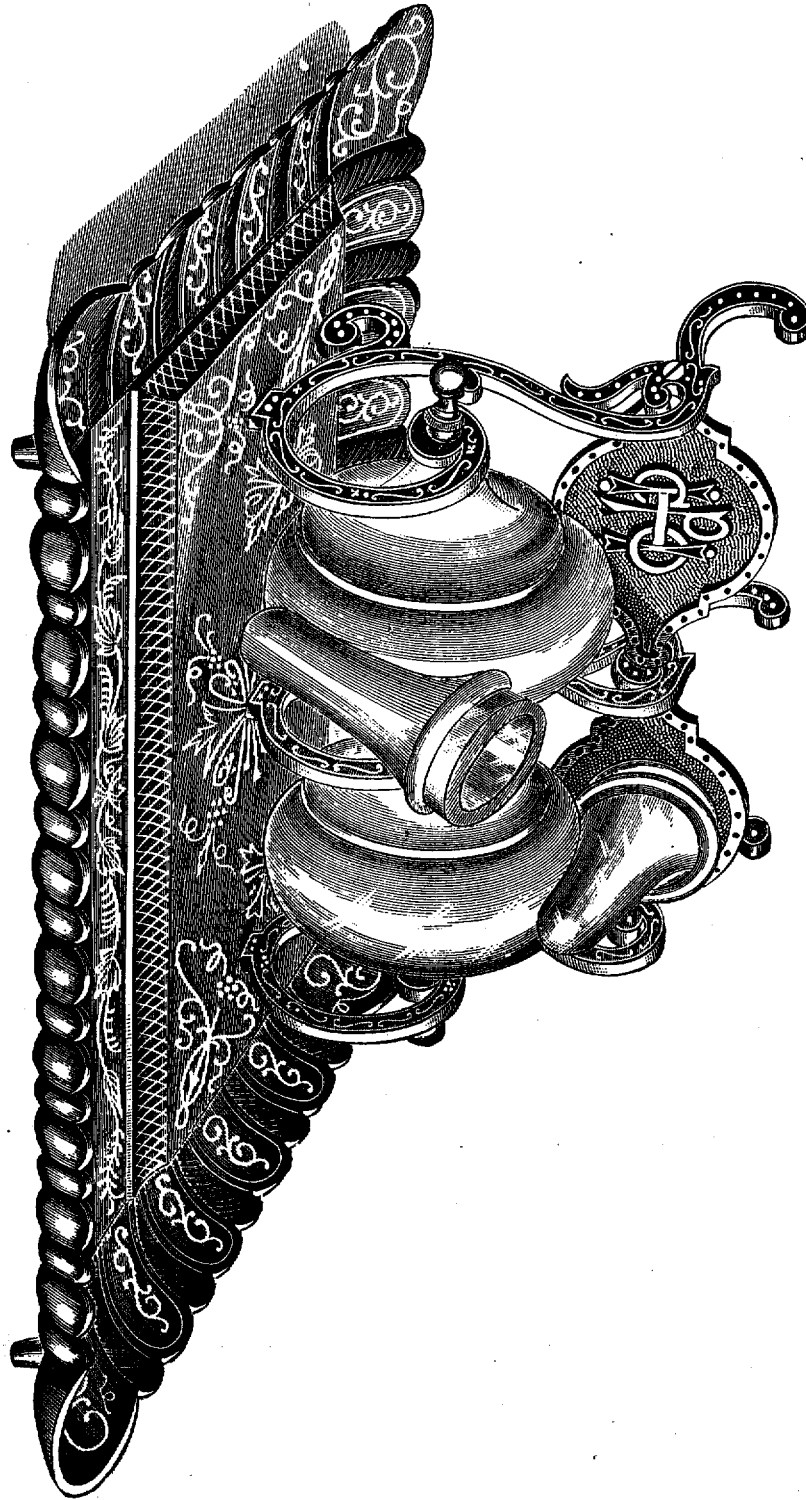

DESIGN FOR INKSTAND-FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,655**, dated April 30, 1878; application filed April 2, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WOLCOTT A. HULL, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern for Inkstand-Frames, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying illustration, making part of this specification.

In the illustration, A represents the platform or base of my inkstand-frame, formed of the raised part C and the curved part D, made in one piece. The curved part D, surrounding the entire raised part, is scalloped on the edges, as seen at E. F are arms projecting upward from the raised part C, and fastened thereto, said arms being curved, as shown in the illustration. These arms are three in number. Between each of the said arms are disks G.

The whole platform-base, arms, and disks or stopples may be variously ornamented by

different figures or designs, as required; but I do not intend to limit myself to such ornamentation, or any fixed decoration as applied to the platform-base, arms, or disks, it being my purpose to claim the inkstand-frame, as described and shown.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for an inkstand-frame, consisting of the platform A, having the raised surface C and curved surface D, surrounding said raised surface, said curved surface being configured as shown at E, arms F, curved as shown, between which are the disks G, all ornamented as shown and described.
