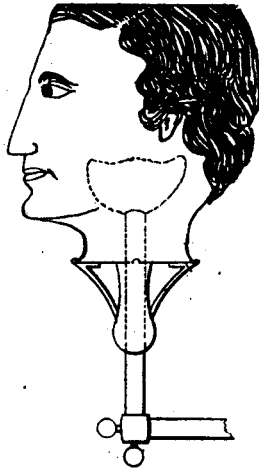

DESIGN FOR LAMP-SHADES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,678**, dated May 14, 1878; application filed April 16, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ROBERT HEMINGRAY, of Covington, in the county of Kenton and State of Kentucky, have originated a new, useful, and original configuration of an article of manufacture—to wit, of Shades for Lights—of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification.

My design consists of a lamp shade or globe ornamented by imparting thereto the form of a human head, as shown in the drawing, cut

away on a straight line to form the top opening.

The neck portion is formed with a flange, by which the globe is connected to the burner.

I claim—

The design for an ornamental lamp shade or globe, having the configuration of a human head, with a flanged neck and open at the top, as shown and described.
