JAMES M. CONNER, OF GREENVILLE, NEW JERSEY.

DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,685**, dated May 21, 1878; application filed April 25, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES M. CONNER, of Greenville, Hudson county, New Jersey, have invented a new Design for a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made; and consists of a letter shaded upon the right and bottom by a light line.

In the letters B, D, P, and R, the upper rounding portion of the letter is curved around and terminates upon the left of the up-and-down portion of the letters.

The letters A, B, D, M, and R are provided with a curved line terminating in a dot placed at the bottom upon the left of the up-and-down portion of the letters.

The letters C, F, G, K, U, V, W, and X have the curved line terminating in the dot placed at the top of the letter upon the extreme right.

The letter E has the curved line terminating in the dot upon the right at top and bottom.

The letters N, S, Y, and Z have the curved line terminating in the dot at the upper right-hand and lower left-hand terminations of the letters.

The letter T has the curved line terminating in the dot upon the right and left of its top cross-line.

The symbol & has both of its terminations provided with the curved line terminating in the dot.

The dollar-mark has its up-and-down portion provided at the bottom with the curved line terminating in the dot.

The figure 2 has the curved line terminating in the dot upon the right of its horizontal portion.

The upper portion of the figure 5 is provided upon the right with the curved line terminating in a dot.

The upper portion of the figure 7 is provided upon the left with the curved line terminating in a dot.

Having now set forth my invention, what I claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-types, as set forth.
