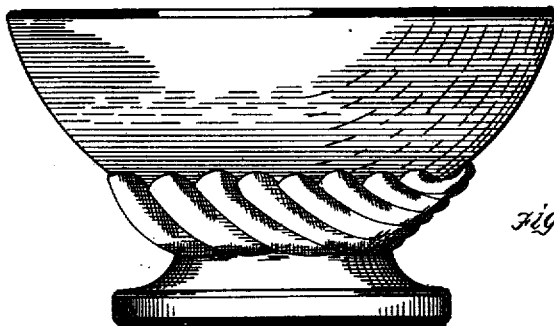
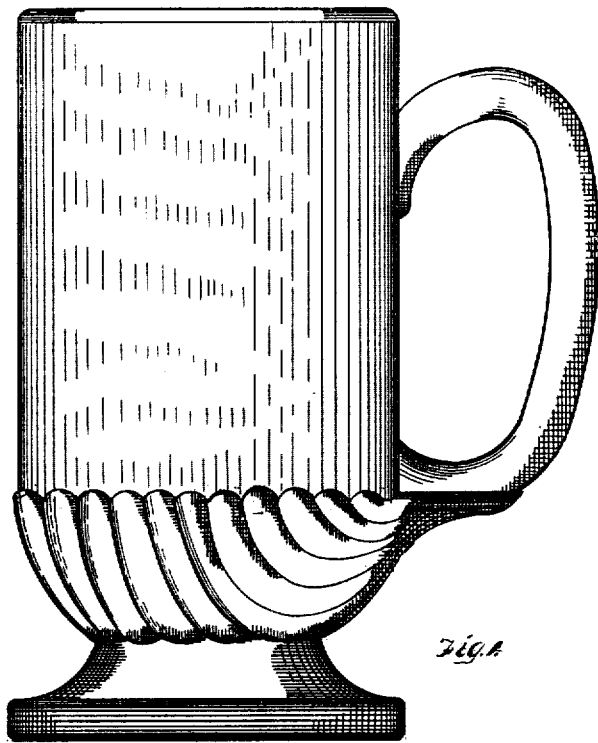

DESIGN FOR GLASSWARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,688**, dated May 21, 1878; application filed May 11, 1878.
[Term of patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MATTHEW SMITH, of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Design for Glassware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which shows my new design in, first, a handled article, and, second, in a bowl.

My new design consists in a glass bowl, vase, goblet, pitcher, mug, or other glass article having a shell base.

The drawing illustrates the design.

In handled articles I prefer to have the convergent point of the flutes or lines of the shell

at the base of the handle. The flutes may be convex or concave, or of other form, substantially similar in general appearance.

The upper part of the bowl or other article may be plain or ornamented.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design hereinbefore described and shown, consisting of a hollow glass article having a shell base.
