

DESIGN FOR CLOCK-CASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,689, dated May 21, 1878; application filed May 13, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY J. DAVIES, of the city of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Glass Fronts of Clock-Cases, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

A represents the glass front of a clock-case, and B the frame which surrounds the same. C is the dial arranged within the upper part of the glass-frame. The frame and dial may be of any shape or figure that may be selected. On the glass front, below the dial, are repre-

On the glass front, below the dial, are represented, by printing, painting, stenciling, or engraving, a pair of lace window-curtains, D

D, having the lower parts drawn aside and held by loops or bands at a a, in such manner as to leave between their lower parts a clear space, the glass front thus presenting the appearance of a lace-curtained window, the upper part of which contains the dial of the clock.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for the glass fronts of clock-cases, in which the glass is ornamented or embellished to present the appearance of a lace-curtained window, the upper part of which is occupied by the dial of the clock, substantially as herein specified.
