


DESIGN FOR BOTTLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,709, dated June 4, 1878; application filed April 26, 1878. [Term of patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LÉON GEISTODT, of Paris, France, have invented a new and original Design for Bottles, of which the following is a specification:

In the accompanying drawing, Figure 1 represents a side elevation, and Fig. 2 a vertical transverse section, of a bottle showing my

design.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

The object of the present invention is to provide a novel design for a cognac and brandy bottle; and it consists in a bottle having bulging sides, with projections or beads thereon, and provided with front and rear walls, arranged nearly parallel to each other, and having a central depression for the reception of a medallion. Similar medallions are also placed on the faces or highest points of the front and rear walls.

Referring to the drawings, A represents a bottle that bulges out from the neck at both sides d thereof down to the bottom, but that is made with front and rear walls e. The front and rear walls are provided with central depressions a, as shown clearly in Fig. 2, by which the central portions of these walls are made to touch each other, so as to form an annular space around the connecting center.

On the crests of the bulging sides d are arranged fanciful projections or beads C, that impart a characteristic appearance to the bottle.

The front and rear walls of the bottle do

not bulge from the neck, but are nearly parallel to each other, with a central depression for the medallion.

The depressed centers of the bottle, as well as the front and rear walls of the same, are arranged with raised medallions D, of round or other shape, having fleurs de lis molded thereon, the whole forming a bottle of unique and fanciful style and medieval character.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters

Patent, is-

1. The design for a bottle consisting of bulging sides and front and rear walls, having central concave depressions, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for a bottle consisting of the combination of front and rear walls, having centrally depressed portions with bulging sides, having projections or beads extending along the crests of the same, substantially as shown.

3. The design for a bottle consisting of the combination of front and rear walls, arranged nearly parallel to each other, and bulging sides, with projections or beads along the crests of the sides, as shown.

4. The design for a bottle consisting of centrally-depressed front and rear walls, having raised medallions at their centers and on their faces or highest points, as herein shown.
