DESIGN FOR GLASS AND LAVA WARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,729, dated June 18, 1878; application filed June 10, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be itknown that I, FREDERICK S. SHIRLEY, of New Bedford, in the county of Bristol and State of Massachusetts, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Glassware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification.

My invention relates to an improvement in designs for glassware; and it consists in making articles of glassware of different shapes, and forming their edges of an imitation of cane or bamboo, as will be more fully described hereinafter.

The accompanying drawing represents my invention.

a represents an article of glass or lava ware, which may be of any form or construction pre-

ferred, as my design is equally applicable to many different articles. Around the edges of this article are formed the beads or flanges c, made to represent cane or bamboo, and which edging forms the recessed panels d, which may be plain or ornamented, as preferred. These beads, being made to represent bamboo or cane, give the article a highly ornamental and unique appearance.

Having thus described my invention, I

claim—

As a design for articles of glass and lava ware, the beads or flanges c, made in imitation of bamboo or cane, as shown.
