DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,733**, dated June 25, 1878; application filed June 4, 1878.
[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM W. JACKSON, (assignor to MacKellar, Smiths & Jordan,) of the city and county of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and originated a new Design for a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made, and consists of a text-letter, shaded upon the right and bottom by a series of short horizontal lines.

The letters A, B, E, F, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, R, and Y are adorned at top and bottom, upon the left, by the pennated-like ornaments, as shown. The letters C and G have the pennated-like ornaments upon the right, at the upper termination of the letters, as shown. The letter D has the pennated-like ornament at its base, upon the left, as shown. The letter P has the pennated-like ornament upon the left of its upper portion. The tail of the Q is pennated, as shown. Both terminations of the S have

the pennated-like appearance, as shown. The letters U, V, and W have the pennated-like ornament upon the left, at the top of the up-and-down portions of each letter. The letter X has the pennated-like ornament upon the left at its base. The letter Z has the pennated-like ornament upon the left, at its top and base. All the letters except the A, S, X, and Z are adorned upon the left, about centrally, with the hook-like ornaments. In the letters A, X, and Z a horizontal line is placed across the letters, about centrally.

In the lower-case the shading is preserved, and the pennated-like ornament characterizes the letters g, j, and y.

Having now set forth my design, what I claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-types, as shown and described.
