## DESIGN FOR AN UPRIGHT PIANO-FORTE CASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,741**, dated July 2, 1878; application filed June 20, 1878.  
[Term of patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHRISTIAN FRIEDERICH THEODOR STEINWAY, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated a new Design for Cases of Piano-Fortes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

My design is for the case of upright pianofortes, so called.

The letter A designates the upper part of the front of the case, provided with two panels, O O, containing a new design of scroll-work, the ends of the front of the case having fluted pilasters B. These pilasters B are on their upper ends connected with a molding, a, which runs along the upper edge of the front case, and together with the lid of the piano forms a cornice. The lower ends of these pilasters B rest upon a concave molding, c, which forms a base for the upper part of the front case above the key-board. The casing, which in-

closes the key-board, and which projects as shown, is supported at either end by curved brackets C. These brackets curve inward and join the lower part of the case at the point D, at which point they are decorated in front with ornaments E. The lower portion of the case is provided with a panel, F. The ends of the case have a rabbet, G, near the front edge.

I claim—

The design for a case for an upright piano consisting of panels O containing scroll-work, pilasters B, resting upon concave molding c, cornice a on the upper part of the front case, and curved brackets C, with ornaments E thereon on the lower part of the case, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
