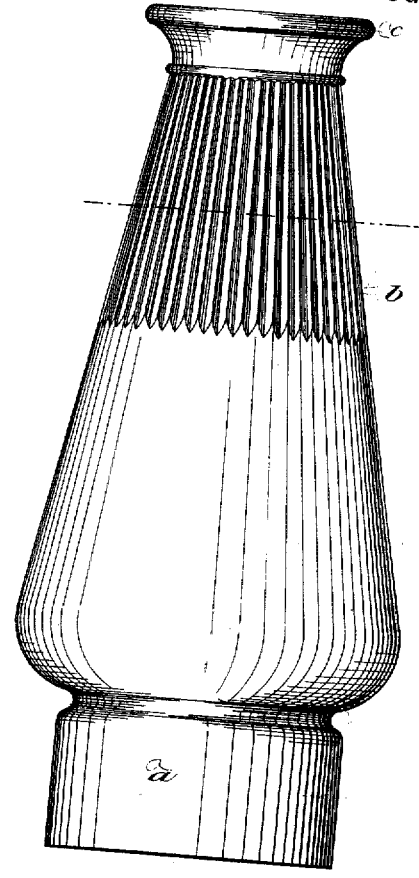
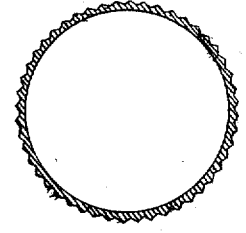

GEORGE W. BLAIR, OF PITTSBURG, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR GLASSWARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,743**, dated July 9, 1878; application filed July 1, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. BLAIR, of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Design for Glassware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification, and illustrating my design as applied to a lamp-chimney.

This design is applicable to chimneys, combined chimneys and globes, vases, and like articles which taper from at or near the base, or whose general configuration is tapering; and consists in forming the lower or base portion of the taper plain and the upper portion with flutes or prisms, and terminating the fluted portion with a flare or inverted bell.

In the drawing, *a* indicates the lower or

plain portion; *b*, the prisms or fluted portion, and *c* the flared or inverted-bell portion surmounting the fluted portion. The portion *c* is preferably plain, as shown.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A design for chimneys or like hollow tapered ware produced by fluting the upper portion of the tapering surface and surmounting the fluted portion by a flaring portion or inverted bell, the lower tapering portion of the article being plain, substantially as shown and described.
