

DESIGN FOR PAPER CASES FOR CIGARETTES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,750, dated July 9, 1878; application filed August 3, 1877. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH PEARL, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new Design for Paper Cases for Cigarettes, of which the fol-lowing is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification.

A, A', and A" represent two of the sides and one end of a parallelopipedal case. The sides and the end (not shown) are similar to those shown in the drawing. The paper covering said sides and ends is printed to represent wood. The appealant had a side of the contract of the same land and the same land an sent wood. The angular borders b of the case are left white to represent a paper binding, the edges of the said white borders being bounded by fine black lines c.

At one end of the box is printed, upon the paper which forms the outer covering of the box, a miniature representation of a revenuestamp, d, the inner margin of which is bounded by a black line, c'. The said miniature representation of a revenue-stamp extends entirely across three of the sides of the case, and has the appearance of having its ends extend

partly over another side of the case, said ends being also bounded by the black line c'.

One end of the parallelopipedal-shaped case is left open, and the upper edge of said case is formed with a hinged end, having a flap, said end being also provided with a white angular border, b, bounded by black lines c, and the flap on the said hinged end is plain, and adapted to be inserted in the open end of the case.

I claim-

The design for a cigarette-case consisting of a parallelopiped box, having its sides, except a plain border around each, painted in imitation of wood, and around one end of the said box the imitation of a revenue-stamp, and an oval label lapping one longitudinal edge, and another oval label on the center of the top, with any appropriate words printed or painted thereon, as shown and described.
