

DESIGN FOR STOVE-POLISH PACKAGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,751, dated July 9, 1878; application filed May 28, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY S. ZIEGLER, of the city of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new Form of Box-Lid for Metallic Boxes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

A represents a circular metallic box with movable lid; B, the said box without the lid, and C the lid thereof disconnected from said

box.

The said box and lid may be constructed of tinned sheet-iron, or other convenient metal, and, by means of dies or stamps, struck into the proper shape.

My design shows a flat circular box, A, with

lid C, having a beveled edge, (marked d,) connecting the top border of the lid with its vertical rim, and having a depressed center, (marked e.) The beveled edge d is at a pretty sharp angle, and the central portion of the lid (marked e) is depressed, so as to make a raised border, f, of about an eighth of an inch width all around the upper surface of said lid.

What I claim as my invention is-

A flat circular box-lid having a depressed center, a substantially vertical rim, and a plane bevel connecting the rim and the top border of the lid.
