

## DESIGN FOR FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,754**, dated July 16, 1878; application filed June 28, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES HERITAGE, of Warren, in the county of Worcester and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a Pattern for Heavy Napped Woolen Fabrics, suitable for overcoatings and other similar uses, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which constitutes a part of this specification.

My said novel design consists of a series of parallel longitudinal stripes of plain napfinish, alternating with intermediate parallel stripes of tufted nap, similar to the so-called "petersham" finish, the whole being crossed diagonally with a third series of shaded or color stripes.

Referring to the drawing, the tufted stripes are shown at A, the plain map stripes at B, and the diagonal shaded stripes at C. The shaded stripes C are preferably formed in the weave, and any suitable colors may be employed. The width of the stripes may be varied to any desired extent.

I claim as my invention—

The design for overcoatings and other heavy napped woolen fabrics, consisting of the alternating parallel plain and tutted nap stripes, crossed diagonally by shaded or color stripes, substantially in the manner described.
