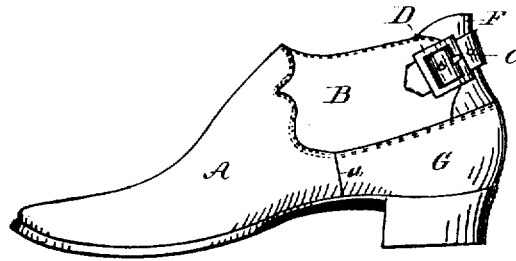

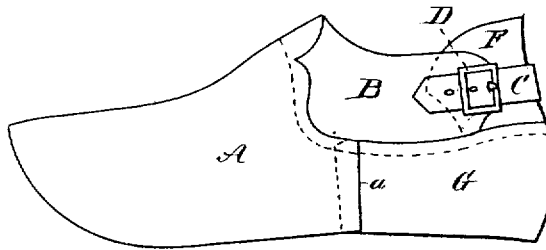

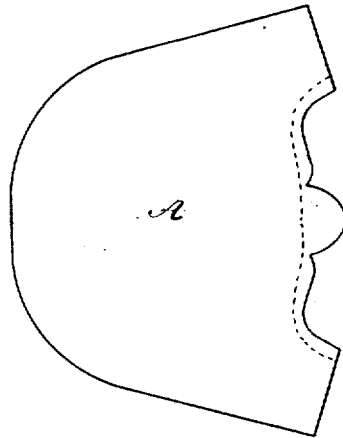

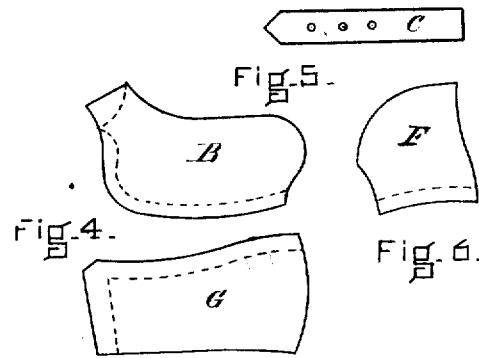

JAMES F. EMERSON, OF WAKEFIELD, MASSACHUSETTS.

DESIGN FOR SHOES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,757**, dated July 23, 1878; application filed May 24, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES F. EMERSON, of Wakefield, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have originated a new Design for Shoes, of which the following is a full, clear, concise, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making a part hereof, in which—

Figure 1 shows my new shoe.

My design for a shoe consists in carrying the front piece A well up over the ankle, sloping the upper edge of the two side pieces B so as to expose the wearer's ankle, and then curving it down near the back of the shoe till it meets the piece G, and in carrying the back piece F up a little higher than the height of the front piece A, a part of it being hidden from view by the pieces B and the strap and

buckle C D. This configuration I believe to be new to me.

In order that those skilled in the art may be enabled to make a shoe embodying my design, I have shown in Fig. 2 a shoe of the configuration above described, closed, but not sewed, and in Figs. 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7, the several parts of which the upper of the shoe is made, although the parts A and G may be cut in one piece without changing the configuration of my shoe.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a low-cut shoe having substantially the configuration above described.
