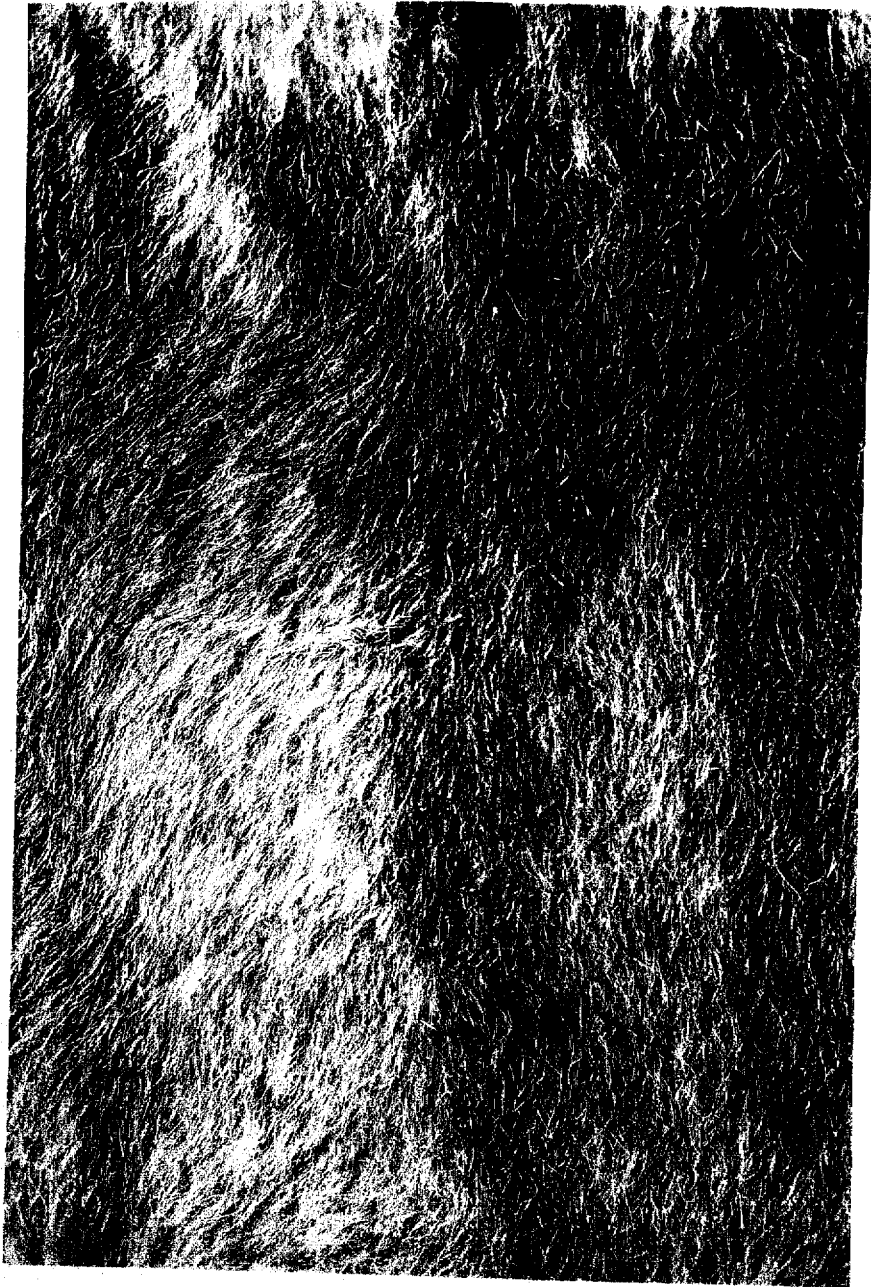

THOMAS GOODALL, OF SANFORD, MAINE.

DESIGN FOR PLUSH OR OTHER GOODS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,758**, dated July 23, 1878; application filed July 10, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS GOODALL, of Sanford, county of York, and State of Maine, have originated and designed a Pattern for Nap or Plush Goods and other Fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

a represents a portion of the body of the goods, or the groundwork, so called, and *b* a portion of the design or figure.

The designs are intended to imitate the form of figure or coloring on the bellies of Siberian squirrels. The figures are arranged in rows, as seen in the illustration, the narrow parts of one row of figures being next to the broad parts of the next row of figures.

I make the colors themselves in considerable variety; but I do not consider the color as an essential element of the design. Such variety of coloring may be adopted as will best serve the object to be attained—to wit, the imitation of the skin of the animal as nearly as may be done, although the coloring may not be the same.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for plush goods and other fabrics, which is composed of the imitative figures, arranged substantially as herein described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
