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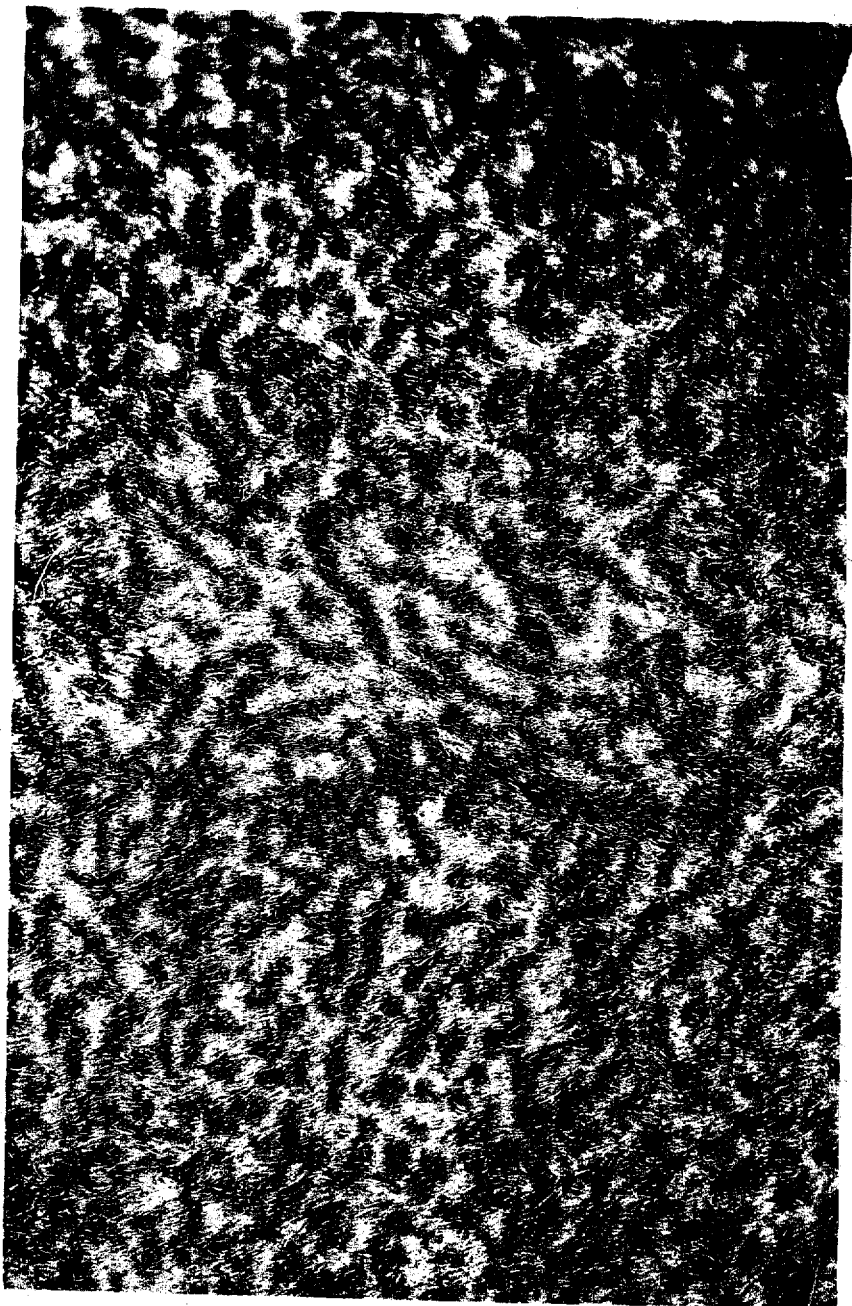

DESIGN FOR PLUSH OR OTHER GOODS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,759**, dated July 23, 1878; application filed July 10, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS GOODALL, of Sanford, county of York, and State of Maine, have invented and designed a Pattern for Nap or Plush Goods and other Fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The body of the goods is made of a white or lighter color than the figures. The figure consists of certain irregularly-disposed lines or spots, or both darker than the body of the goods, and arranged either separately or in

clusters or groups, as shown in the illustration.

At certain distances on the face of the goods there run darker or denser veins or lines of the figuring, from which lines branch outwardly the other lines or spots referred to. Such line is shown at *a*.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for plush goods and other fabrics composed of the figures arranged and disposed substantially as herein described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
