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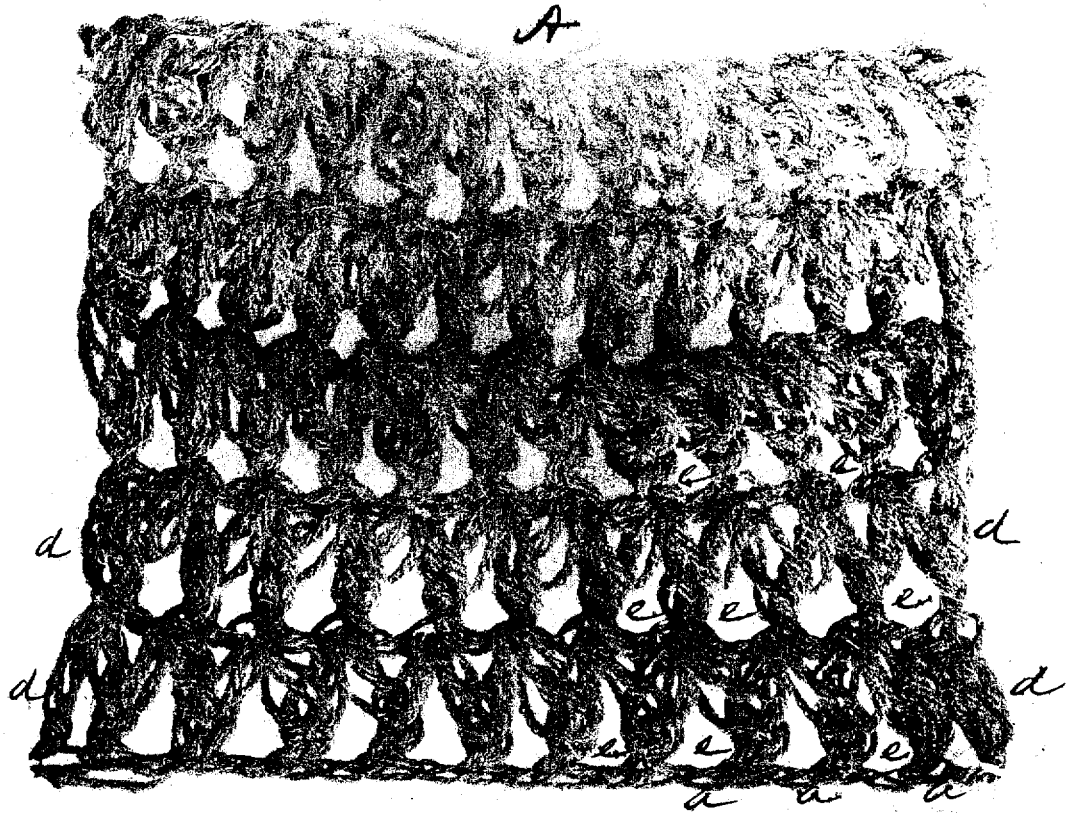

DESIGN FOR CROCHET-STITCH.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,760**, dated July 30, 1873; application filed June 28, 1873.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CAROLINE A. BURNHAM, of West Somerville, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for a Crochet-Stitch, of which the following is a specification:

My invention relates to a novel and ornamental stitch for crochet-work, adapted to various articles of wear, and is illustrated in the accompanying photograph, in which A represents the crochet-fabric. The said fabric may be made of crimped or plain yarn or thread, composing a series of loops, each gathered together at their lower ends at intervals *c c* on a line, *a*, and widening at the upper ends, where they are all joined together, as shown at *b b*, the lower ends of each longitudinal series *d d* being arranged over the open

spaces *e e* of the next series below, each line forming a series of lily-shaped loops joined together in parallel rows.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a crochet-fabric consisting of a series of loops, *c c*, gathered together on a line, *a*, at intervals, and widening and meeting together at the upper ends, *b b*, the spaces *e e* of each longitudinal series alternating with those above and below, as shown and described.
