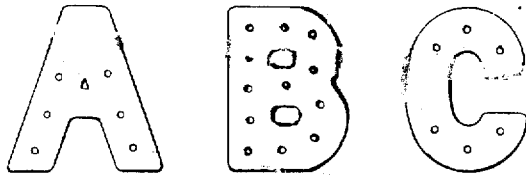

DESIGN FOR CRACKERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,765**, dated August 6, 1878; application filed July 3, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, CHARLES S. FOWLER, of Brooklyn, Kings county, in the State of New York, and LUCIUS A. ROCKWELL, of New York city, in the same State, have invented a new and original Design for Biscuits or Crackers and other analogous articles, of which the following is a specification:

Our design for crackers is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, which represents the letters of the alphabet at the commencement of the series.

The biscuits or crackers or analogous articles are made of dough, and may be cut out by dies in the ordinary manner or otherwise, but having the form and configuration of the several letters of the alphabet from A to Z,

inclusive, and are baked in the ordinary manner, so as to form biscuits or crackers, or other analogous articles, having the configuration and form of the several letters of the alphabet, as before stated.

We claim as our invention—

The design for biscuits, crackers, and analogous articles of manufacture, consisting of the configuration and outline in the form of the several letters of the alphabet, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
