

DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,780, dated August 13, 1878; application filed July 23, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES MAGEE, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photographic illustration represents a face view of my new design for

This invention relates to a new design for a carpet, oil-cloth, or similar fabric; and consists in the new arrangement and ornamenta-

tion of figures hereinafter described.

The body of the carpet contains on the background, which is decorated with floral designs, an irregular shield, a, which is defined at the top and bottom by bouquets of flowers and leaves b and at its sides by a partially-curved and partially-angular border, c. At one side of the shield a is a figure, d, which contains small rectangular ornaments and flowers and leaves, as shown.

In the design is also an approximately hexagonal figure, e, having two straight parallel sides, and each pair of the other sides joined at an obtuse angle. This figure is also partly surrounded by a border, and is embellished

by smaller decorations. f is a rectilinear_irregular figure at the side of the figure e. Between the figures f and e and the shield a is a smaller ornamentation, g, of irregular design.

1. The design for a carpet having the irregular shield a, which is defined at its top and bottom by the bouquets b and at its sides by the partially-curved and partially-angular border \hat{c} , substantially as shown.

2. The design for the figure d, containing rectangular ornaments and flowers and leaves,

substantially as shown.

3. The design for the figure e, having two straight parallel sides, and each pair of the other sides joined at an obtuse angle, substantially as shown.

4. The design for the rectilinear irregular figure f and the ornamentation g, substantially as shown.

5. The design for a carpet having the shield a, bouquets b, border c, figures def, and ornamentation g, substantially as shown.
