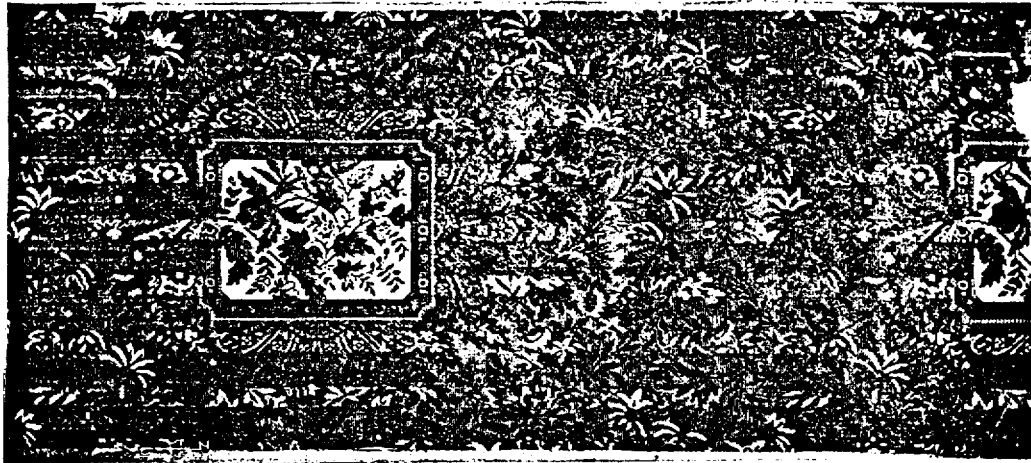

DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,781**, dated August 13, 1878; application filed July 23, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN NEIL, of New York city, county of New York, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photograph illustrates my new design.

This invention relates to a new design for a carpet, oil-cloth, or similar fabric; and consists in the new arrangement and ornamentation of figures hereinafter described.

In the photographic illustration, the letter A represents a figure having the outline of a rectangular parallelogram. This figure is

made of different color than the background of the carpet, and is surrounded by a border, *b*, and a radial embellishment, *c*, as shown. *d* is a group of flowers and leaves arranged within the figure A. At the sides of the figure A the carpet is ornamented by the representation of stems of flowers and leaves *e* profusely scattered upon the background.

I claim—

The design for a carpet, substantially as shown.
