

DESIGN FOR FUNERAL ORNAMENTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,784, dated August 20, 1878; application filed August 5, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES E. McFar-Lan, of Cincinnati, county of Hamilton, Ohio, have invented a new Design for Funeral Ornaments, of which the following is a clear and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

My invention relates, in chief, to an ornament with special reference to funeral decorations—namely, for attachment to or around a coffin or hearse; and consists of a design of an open book, exhibiting the leaves and cover, with or without corner-pieces and clasps. Upon this representation of a hook I inscribe, by the use of lines or surfaces raised above or depressed below the body of the work, appropriate texts or mottoes, titles, and decorations.

I have exhibited in the drawing annexed a

title—"Holy Bible"—and the text "Blessed are the Dead which Die in the Lord;" also a rose, a bud, and surrounding leaves. These may be substituted by other appropriate titles, texts, and ornaments.

What I claim as my invention is-

1. The design herein described of a funeral ornament, consisting of an open book, with appropriate inscriptions and ornaments.

2. The use of texts or mottoes on a book-shaped design, as herein represented and described.

3. The use of emblems on a book-shaped design, as herein described and represented, and for the purpose specified.
